The location announcement of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was given and the meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m.

1) **MINUTES: Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, January 26, 2010.**

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Workman seconded approval of the minutes. Hudkins, Schorr, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.

2) **CLAIMS: Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, February 2, 2010.**

MOTION: Schorr moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the claims. Schorr, Hudkins, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.

3) **SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS:**

A. **Lancaster County Visitors Improvement Fund Grant to Updowntowners, Inc. – Deb Johnson, Updowntowners, Inc.; Jeff Maul, Convention and Visitors Bureau Executive Director. (See Item 4A for correlating document.)**

Jeff Maul said the previous year was a strong year for tourism. He noted 11 regional and national events are scheduled for this summer which will generate over 45,000 hotel room night stays.

Maul said four grants were awarded in the last quarter of 2009, with one going to Updowntowners for a web site update. Deb Johnson expressed her appreciation for the grant. She submitted a document outlining the changes to their web site (Exhibit A), including more links to the community, improved marketing tools, more interactive features and better web site statistics.

3) SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS CONTINUED:

Johnson gave an overview of the Updowntowners organization. She said the Downtown Lincoln Association is their parent entity, but Updowntowners has their own Board of Directors, 501c6, bylaws and articles of incorporation. They are 94% privately funded. Johnson said Updowntowners produces around 30 festivals and events each year, including Celebrate Lincoln. This festival brought tourists from 38 states and four countries.

Hudkins thanked Johnson for providing information on the project. He felt it was an excellent way to attract visitors.

Per Schorr's request, Maul discussed the new arena project. He said several groups have looked at Lincoln for sporting events and festivals; revenues generated through lodging tax and sales tax from these tourism activities would have an immediate effect on the community. In addition, his organization has been working for nine years on the religious conference market, which generally requires an arena setting and would bring visitors to the community for four to five days. Maul said the arena vote would take place on May 11.

Hudkins stated the project would attract new revenues to Lincoln, as well as retain around \$22,000,000 from current events.

B. Resolution No. 10-15 in the matter of proclaiming Census 2010 a top priority – Brandon Garrett, Planning Department. (See Item 4B for correlating document.)

Brandon Garrett discussed the 2010 census, noting it is the shortest census since 1790. He said the City of Lincoln and Lancaster County have teamed up to form a Complete Count Committee to support the efforts. The main focus of the committee is to target the hard-to-count population, including minorities, immigrants, students, low-income citizens and renters.

Todd Wiltgen, U.S. Census Bureau, distributed the census questionnaire (Exhibit B) and discussed efforts to promote the process. He said the questionnaire includes ten questions for the primary person and seven questions for each of the other household residents. The information collected is considered personal, and census employees may not share the information with any federal agency or individual. Wiltgen said census day is April 1; questionnaires will be mailed March 16. He noted the 2000 census response rate in Lancaster County was 76% while the state had a 75% response rate. Wiltgen explained the census is important because it determines representation in Congress and the House of Representatives, is used by the Nebraska legislature to redistrict the 49 members of the unicameral and is used to redraw political boundaries for the County Board and the City Council districts. He said they are partnering with the Lincoln Area Agency on Aging to help the elderly, using senior centers and the City library system for assistance and meeting with the student body at University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Wiltgen said there will be additional questionnaires mailed out to targeted neighborhoods with low response rates. He also explained the partnership support program, in which the County and City received funding to purchase 1000 gloves and hats to be distributed to six schools with large hard-to-count populations.

Schorr said it is important to note the form is addressed to "resident" so people look for it and do not throw it in the trash without realizing what it is.

3) **SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS CONTINUED:**

Workman noted renters generally move on the first of the month, which could account for some unreturned census forms. Wiltgen said their non-response follow-up starts after May 1 with visits to each household that did not return a census form. The goal is to finish in July.

Workman asked if non-responders would be estimated. Wiltgen said the Supreme Court has ruled that the census cannot use estimates to alter the actual count. The congressional portion is determined based on responses from the form.

Stevens questioned the process of using another form if the original form is destroyed or marked incorrectly. Wiltgen said the mailed forms have an address with a bar code. When completed, the form is scanned and crossed off the address database. If someone goes to an assistance center, the address would be handwritten and keyed in manually.

4) **NEW BUSINESS:**

- A. **A grant contract with Lancaster County as the sponsor and Updowntowners, Inc., as the grantee, for \$10,000 from the Visitors Improvement Fund for the purpose of updating and revising the Updowntowners' web site to help attract more visitors. The grant period runs from January 1, 2010, to January 1, 2011. (C-10-0039)**

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Schorr seconded approval of the contract. Schorr, Hudkins, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.

- B. **A resolution in the matter of proclaiming Census 2010 a top priority. (R-10-0015)**

MOTION: Schorr moved and Workman seconded approval of the resolution. Workman, Schorr, Hudkins and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.

- C. **A resolution concurring with the State of Nebraska Department of Roads to award a bid to Pavers Companies, in the amount of \$831,554.92, regarding Federal Aid Project LCLC-5280(1), located at Saltillo Road from US-77 to S. 70th Street. The County's share is \$181,554.92. (R-10-0009)**

Don Thomas, County Engineer, said a few other projects have been delayed, so they are able to cover the County's share out of the current budget.

Schorr asked about the resolutions it Items 4D-4H. Thomas said new federal regulations require designating a responsible charge for each federal aid project. Three employees in the County Engineer's office took courses and exams to qualify.

In response to Hudkins question, Thomas said this was the same Saltillo project put on hold the previous July. He noted other federal aid projects are being delayed because focus is on stimulus projects, which may not be done until September.

4) **NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:**

MOTION: Workman moved and Schorr seconded approval of the resolution. Workman, Schorr, Hudkins and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.

D. A resolution in the matter of designating a responsible charge to secure federal funding for Hickman Northeast; Project RUR-3290(2). (R-10-0010)

MOTION: Workman moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the resolution. Schorr, Hudkins, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.

E. A resolution in the matter of designating a responsible charge to secure federal funding for Malcolm Southeast; Project BRO-7055(102). (R-10-0011)

MOTION: Workman moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the resolution. Hudkins, Schorr, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.

F. A resolution in the matter of designating a responsible charge to secure federal funding for Sprague East; Project BR-3280(4). (R-10-0012)

MOTION: Workman moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the resolution. Hudkins, Schorr, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.

G. A resolution in the matter of designating a responsible charge to secure federal funding for Raymond East; Project BR-3370(2). (R-10-0013)

MOTION: Workman moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the resolution. Schorr, Hudkins, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.

H. A resolution in the matter of designating a responsible charge to secure federal funding for Raymond Southeast; Project BR-3405(5). (R-10-0014)

MOTION: Workman moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the resolution. Workman, Schorr, Hudkins and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.

I. A utility location agreement between Lancaster County and Mid-America Pipeline Company, in the amount of \$3,974, to relocate utility facilities to accommodate the grading of Bluff Road between N. 148th Street and N. 190th Street; Project No C55-H-402(1). (C-10-0040)

MOTION: Workman moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the agreement. Schorr, Hudkins, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.

4) **NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:**

- J. **An agreement with Mid-American Center for Orthopedic and Sports Medicine to provide specialized medical care and assistance to Lancaster County General Assistance clients who have pending claims with the Social Security Administration and may be eligible for retroactive Medicaid benefits. The agreement sets forth a reimbursement arrangement in which the County will provide payment for the medical care and Mid-American Center for Orthopedic and Sports Medicine will reimburse the County if/when the General Assistance client is later determined eligible for Medicaid reimbursement. The agreement is effective upon execution of both parties and contains a 30-day termination provision. (C-10-0041)**

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Schorr seconded approval of the agreement. Workman, Schorr, Hudkins and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.

- K. **A contract between Lancaster County, the City of Lincoln, the Public Building Commission and WW Grainger, Inc., for the annual requirements for industrial supplies. The County will pay for services according to the pricing in State of Nebraska contract number 11610 OC. Term of the contract is from December 1, 2009, to November 30, 2010. (C-10-0042)**

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Schorr seconded approval of the contract. Workman, Schorr, Hudkins and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.

- L. **An agreement between Lancaster County and Lisa Oliveras for project developer/presenter for "The Odds Are...", a youth gambling prevention program. Term of the agreement is July 1, 2009, to December 31, 2009. The County's payment for such services will not exceed \$6,000. (C-10-0045)**

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Workman seconded approval of the agreement. Schorr, Hudkins, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.

- M. **A request from Lincoln Endocrinology, L.L.C., for a refund of 2009 personal property tax.**

Scott Gaines, Deputy County Assessor/Register of Deeds, recommended approval of the request. He said application software was erroneously reported and the company is correcting their return to reflect this.

MOTION: Schorr moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the request based on the recommendation of the County Assessor's office. Hudkins, Schorr, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.

- N. **Setting the salary of Yohance Christie, Deputy Public Defender, in the amount of \$56,000 per year, effective January 26, 2010.**

Stevens noted a deputy public defender retired, so this is a replacement and not a new position.

4) **NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:**

MOTION: Workman moved and Schorr seconded approval of the salary. Hudkins, Schorr, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.

O. **Appointment of Timothy Plander and reappointment of Sitaram Jaswal to the Air Pollution Control Advisory Board for a three-year term expiring October 12, 2012.**

Rick Thorson, Environmental Health Supervisor, gave an overview of the candidates. Sitaram Jaswal has served on the Board for two terms; he is a physics and astronomy professor at University of Nebraska. Timothy Plander works for Olson & Associates in Lincoln; he is an environmental scientist with extensive experience in computer modeling for air emissions.

MOTION: Hudkins moved and Schorr seconded approval of the appointment and reappointment. Schorr, Hudkins, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.

P. **Executive Session – Pending Litigation**

The Vice Chair announced the item would be held until the end of the meeting.

ROLL CALL: Schorr, Hudkins, Workman and Stevens voted aye. Motion carried 4-0.





Events and Pages

1. Make site more dynamic by adding flash, movement, slideshow of photos, etc.
2. Be able to change homepage with each event season.
3. Put navigation bar on event homepage, not under information page.
4. Icon with rotating images of sponsor logos on event homepage
5. Music/Animation? (Shows energy of organization/festivals)
6. Improved e-mail marketing tools to capture e-mails and market to a broader audience
7. Create option for blogging
8. Quick links to CVB, CLA, Hotels or any tourism partner on the homepage (logos)
9. Enable a series event like DPS without having to enter each day individually
10. Be able to copy an event and modify it for the new year. (CL/Parade, etc.)
11. Create option to make additional webpages that don't fit into event category (especially with new event planning service)
12. Move event details from the top to below the header (no one sees at top)
13. View a preview of the webpage before making it live
14. Add graphics into event automatically without having to add a graphic and use link
15. Add photos, etc. to entertainment and vendor pages
16. Enable RSS feeds
17. Add a welcome or about us blurb on the homepage

Volunteers

1. Be able to copy time shifts for the volunteer grid for multiple jobs
2. Make a "past volunteer" category to maintain history without emailing
3. Calculate how many volunteers are still needed out of how many total for event
4. Attain volunteer stats, like number of hours, etc. for end of year totals

Members

1. Allow access to account after membership expiration so they can renew
2. Allow volunteers an easy way to become members (Volunteers currently cannot use account to join.)
3. Only mass email those with email addresses filled in to avoid as many bouncebacks

4. Add blogs or chatrooms for more interaction (Add value online for members)
5. Evaluate the idea of more member capabilities/benefits from the website
6. On back end, when searching for members, include company in search results
7. Add areas of interest to registration process

Committees

1. Add people to committee in bulk instead of having to go through individual accounts
2. Allow discussions to take place between committees on the website

Registration

1. Acquire guest names of registrants when registering for event (in addition to member)
2. Verify whether person is a member or not when registering (to make sure right price)
3. Allow members to enter quantity of RSVPs when registering (so they don't have to register multiple times – multiple credit card charges)
4. Allow office staff to enter ticket packages
5. Add a place for registers to add special diet instructions, etc.
6. Add a cap to an event registration
7. Have online applications
8. Have member balance for credited amounts
9. Allow unlimited number of payment categories instead of the current four.
10. Create exportable list of attendees and information for each event.
11. Use CAPCHA to prevent bot activity.
12. Update current online sales for festivals (currently anything we sell reads “Register”)


