The location announcement of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act was given and the meeting was called to order at 9:32 a.m.

1) **MINUTES: Approval of the minutes of the Board of Commissioners meeting held on Tuesday, January 11, 2011.**

**MOTION:** Hudkins moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the minutes. Hudkins, Raybould, Heier, Smoyer and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

2) **CLAIMS: Approval of all claims processed through Tuesday, January 18, 2011.**

**MOTION:** Heier moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the claims. Raybould, Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

3) **SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS:**

A. **Presentation of the County Sheriff Employee Awards for outstanding service in 2010.**

Terry Wagner, County Sheriff, presented the awards to each recipient.

B. **Hickman Regional Recreational & Event Complex Master Plan – Brett Baker, Hickman City Administrator and Economic Development Coordinator.**

### 3) **SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS CONTINUED:**

Brett Baker gave an overview of the Regional Recreational & Event Complex (Exhibit A). He said local trails and lakes were taken into consideration for the project and noted receipt of a grant for approximately \$500,000 to construct a trail along Hickman Road. He reviewed possible sites being considered.

David Potter, JEO Senior Planner, said the plan is based on a 100-acre complex, which would be developed in four phases. Phase 1 would include land acquisition, grading, a drive-in theater area, large event parking, a shelter, playground equipment and a restroom facility. Phase 2 would include a ball field complex, a concession stand, batting cages, roads and additional parking. Phase 3 would include multipurpose fields, multipurpose courts, picnic shelters, restrooms, a dog exercise area, a skate park, a computerized playground, Frisbee golf and additional parking. Phase 4 would consist of a golf course and clubhouse. Appropriate lighting, trails, sidewalks, sewer lines, landscaping and sitting areas would be installed as the complex is developed. He said the plan would likely evolve more as the location is obtained, funding achieved and construction documents prepared.

Jeff Maul, Lincoln Convention & Visitors Bureau Executive Director, said he felt the project would benefit Lancaster County.

Hudkins commended the project. He suggested working with Gary Bergman at the Lancaster County / University of Nebraska-Lincoln Extension Office.

#### **C. Southeast Community College Annual Report – Jack Huck, President.**

Jack Huck gave an overview of the Southeast Community College Annual Report (Exhibits B and C). He reviewed graduate information, tuition and fees, national ranking, enrollment, expenditures and revenue, and local property tax.

Hudkins praised the college for providing affordable opportunities for students. He noted the number of students that stay in Nebraska.

#### **D. Introduction of Clover Frederick and Nate Woods, members of the Keno Human Services Advisory Board.**

Schorr explained that a percentage of Keno funds are retained by the County: 60% are allocated to Human Service projects in the community and 40% are allocated to future building endowments.

Nate Woods and Clover Frederick introduced themselves and provided a brief history.

Raybould commended Woods and Frederick for their service.

Schorr discussed the large amount of fund requests received by the Keno Human Services Advisory Board and the difficult decisions involved in choosing recipients for the funds.

### 4) **PUBLIC HEARING:**

#### **A. A request to vacate North Street abutting Lot 1, Block 1, as platted in the unincorporated village of Agnew, Lancaster County, Nebraska.**

#### 4) PUBLIC HEARING CONTINUED:

Gene Peaks was administered the oath. He said he has lived adjacent to North Street for 23 years and has maintained a garden in this area. Peaks said he would like to have the ground in his name. Hudkins asked Peaks if he visited with the landowner of the parcel between 84<sup>th</sup> Street and the railroad tracks. Peaks said he had not.

Mike DeKalb, Lincoln-Lancaster County Planning, was administered the oath. He showed a map, explaining the area to be vacated and the position of the adjacent landowners. He noted that Todd Jansa, adjacent landowner, would lose access to the north part of his property if North Street is vacated.

Hudkins said he was initially unaware that this area was an entrance to the north end of the Jansa property. He said there was a discrepancy in the lot line and the fence line, which raised questions on ownership and use.

John Austin was administered the oath. He questioned if the railroad would still have use for this area. Hudkins said the coop went into bankruptcy and the land was sold to Todd Jansa. Austin felt the vacation should be approved if the Board could satisfy everyone involved.

Todd Jansa was administered the oath. Jansa said closing North Street would restrict access to the north end of his property since George Street was closed. He expressed concern over the effect on future development of his property. Smoyer asked Jansa if the vacation could be done with an easement. Jansa felt that was not a good option since it would be difficult to bring in large equipment. Raybould asked what was farmed on his property. Jansa said he stores machinery there. Raybould asked if he ever tried to access the property using North Street. Jansa said he once tried but did not want to drive over the garden. Smoyer asked about other access along Franklin Street. Jansa explained the road comes to a dead end and there is no access north of North Street.

Schorr closed the public hearing.

Brittany Behrens, Deputy County Attorney, said the Board would need to direct her on the resolution. Hudkins asked if a resolution was needed if the Board wished to not vacate. Behrens said a resolution needs to be done either way. The State statute requires the resolution to be done at the next meeting or as soon thereafter as possible. The Board can either vacate the property or not. If the road is vacated, the resolution needs to state if the property will be sold, revert to private ownership, or if it will remain in the public for public use. Hudkins asked Behrens to check the statutes to see if there are any restrictions on closing a road that would limit access to an adjacent property. He felt full access should be open to Jansa's property.

#### 5) NEW BUSINESS:

- A. **A resolution in the matter of amending the Lancaster County Purchasing Manual to require that purchases resulting in contracts for amounts equal to or greater than \$20,000 must receive a majority vote of approval from the Lancaster County Board of Commissioners prior to the contract being drawn by the Purchasing Department. (R-11-0007)**

**MOTION:** Heier moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the resolution. Hudkins, Raybould, Heier, Smoyer and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

5) **NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:**

**B. A resolution in the matter of approving annual salary increases for Directors, Assistant Directors, Psychiatrists, Sheriff Captains, District Court Law Clerks, bailiffs, the Child Support Referee and Attorneys. (R-11-0008)**

Jody Nelson, District Court Judge, discussed the bailiff salaries. She explained that previously the District Court and Juvenile Court bailiffs were paid more than Paralegal 2's. Approximately ten years ago, the County Board decided to equalize the Paralegal 2 salaries to the bailiff salaries. However, Paralegal 2's are classified, which allows for step increases in pay, as well as cost of living increases. Since bailiffs only received cost of living increases, they fell behind in salary. A few years ago the Board agreed to work on equalizing the salaries again. She said the bailiff salaries are only \$391 behind and asked that they be made equal. Raybould asked if the same situation would occur the next year. Nelson said the bailiffs would be at the top rung of pay for paralegal 2s so everyone would receive only cost of living raises from that point. Hudkins said the Board has tried to solve the inequity, but it was a stretch to do as much as they did this year.

John Austin said approval of more money for the bailiffs would open the door for everyone else to ask for more money.

**MOTION:** Heier moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the resolution. Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins, Raybould and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

**C. A recommendation from the Purchasing Agent to award a contract to Mainline Mechanical, Inc., in the amount of \$54,521, for chilled water piping replacement for Trabert Hall. (B-11-0004)**

**MOTION:** Heier moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the recommendation. Smoyer, Hudkins, Raybould, Heier and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

**D. A recommendation from the Purchasing Agent and Emergency Management Director to award a contract to Schmader Electric Construction Company, Inc., in the amount of \$90,312, for outdoor warning sirens and replacement in Bennett, Malcolm, Palmyra, Firth and Raymond. (B-11-0005)**

Doug Ahlberg, Emergency Management Director, said the original grant was in the amount of \$124,000 for siren installation. Since the bid came in less than the grant amount, he would see if another siren could be purchased at the same rate. Ahlberg noted the siren listed as Palmyra is actually for Panama. He said DC-powered sirens are currently in Denton, Hallam and Hickman.

**MOTION:** Hudkins moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the recommendation. Hudkins, Raybould, Heier, Smoyer and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

**E. An agreement between Lancaster County and All Needs Computer & Mailing Services, Inc., for mailing services for the Lancaster County Treasurer. The County shall pay for products and services according to the contractor's proposal, excluding the \$10 per day pickup fee. Term of the agreement is from the date of execution to December 31, 2011. (C-11-0039)**

5) **NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:**

Liz Thanel, Accountant for the County Treasurer's Office, said this is a license plate year, which will require a very large mailing. She said her office and the mailroom would not be able to handle the large mailing without interfering with their normal level of service. Hudkins asked about the credentials of the company used. Thanel said All Needs was the only bidder, but she checked with the post office who said they were a reputable company.

**MOTION:** Hudkins moved and Heier seconded approval of the agreement. Raybould, Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

- F. An agreement between Cardiac Science Corporation, the City of Lincoln, Lancaster County and the Lincoln-Lancaster County Public Building Commission for automated external defibrillators (AEDs). Pricing will be pursuant to Purchasing Solutions Alliance Contract No. 09-100 dated October 9, 2009. Term of the agreement is from the date of execution through October 8, 2011. (C-11-0040)**

Bob Walla, Assistant Purchasing Agent, said the AEDs were originally purchased using a contract through the Veterans Hospital. The contract expired, but the same company was used for the corresponding accessories. He said Purchasing Solutions Alliance offered the best deal. The AEDs, including the accessories, are replaced on an as needed basis.

**MOTION:** Smoyer moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the agreement. Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins, Raybould and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

- G. A maintenance agreement with Microfilm Imaging Systems, in the amount of \$895, for a Canon scanner located in the Clerk of the District Court's Office. Term of the agreement is February 1, 2011, to January 31, 2012. (C-11-0041)**

Heier asked for the item to be held. He said the machine was purchased in 2004. With a maintenance agreement cost of \$895 per year, six years later the total cost is \$6,145, versus the cost of \$4,500 for a new machine. Hudkins agreed the options should be reviewed before approval. The Board agreed to hold the item.

- H. A licensure renewal application to operate a mental health center with the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services in connection with the Lancaster County Mental Health Center. The County will pay \$250 for the renewal license. (C-11-0038)**

**MOTION:** Raybould moved and Smoyer seconded approval of the application. Hudkins, Raybould, Heier, Smoyer and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.

- I. A grant contract with Lincoln Literacy Council to provide funds in the amount of \$10,000 to support capacity building. Term of the grant contract is July 1, 2010, to June 30, 2011. (C-11-0042)**

Item was held per request of the County Attorney.

5) **NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED:**

Schorr noted there had been almost \$80,000 in requests.

**MOTION:** Raybould moved and Hudkins seconded approval of the funding recommendations. Heier, Smoyer, Hudkins, Raybould and Schorr voted aye. Motion carried 5-0.




# PROJECT SUMMARY

The City of Hickman hired JEO Consulting Group, Inc. to prepare a master plan study for a future regional recreational and event complex to meet the needs of the community and surrounding area. Growth in population and the City's proximity to Lincoln has placed pressure on existing parks, ball fields and other facilities. A steering committee was formed to analyze existing parks and facilities and to explore options for expansion and new recreational areas. The committee consisted of community and school leaders. Their charge was to identify recreational opportunities for the community, school district, and surrounding area. In preparing plans for a new regional complex, the City wanted to lead the area in some innovative entertainment, play and event opportunities while providing for the basic youth park and recreational amenities.

The Hickman Regional Recreational and Event Complex Master Plan was completed with the assistance of many individuals. It is realized that such a plan may change over time; however, the master plan gives the community direction and vision in meeting their recreational needs. Various concepts were developed and discussed. From these discussions, a final plan was constructed that best represents the community and its regional goals. The proposed recreational and event complex will offer unique opportunities for Hickman area residents and Norris school students alike. Amenities such as a drive-in theatre/festival area, four-field complex, multi-purpose soccer/football fields, playgrounds, a future par 3 - 9 hole golf course, multi-purpose courts, festival areas, splash park, and parking will surely meet the demands and expectations of the City of Hickman and surrounding areas.

The goal of the park master plan is to provide the residents of Hickman, Norris School District, and Lancaster County with various opportunities to recreate, hold various community functions, and promote regional economic development. Tourism destinations, joint partnerships, shared facilities, and efficient operations were also considered goals in the planning process. A considerable amount of work by the Hickman Parks Foundation and the private sector lies ahead for such a complex to become a reality. Additional planning, fund raising, land acquisition, and marketing, etc., are all necessary for successful construction and operation. Phasing of such a project may be in order, and various facilities could be developed one at a time or simultaneously, depending upon available funds and grant resources received.

The City will form a 501(c)3 Parks Foundation to help with the capital campaign on funding and marketing this proposed regional complex. This Parks Foundation will continue to work on promoting the complex and the Hickman area. Once developed, the complex will become a recreational and event destination facility with endless possibilities in economic development, recreational options, and community activities while promoting community pride and wellness.


### **Community Pride and Economic Development Boosted by Hickman Regional Recreational and Event Complex 2010 Master Plan**

HICKMAN, NEBRASKA – The City of Hickman is planning for a new regional recreational and event complex to offer various sporting and entertainment opportunities for Hickman, Norris School District, and Lancaster County residents. For the past year and a half, a Master Plan has been developed and approved by the City Council that will provide direction in developing this multi-use regional facility. JEO Consulting Group, Inc. of Lincoln assisted the City in completing the Master Plan of the proposed complex to include a drive-in theatre/festival area, four ball fields, multi-purpose soccer/football fields, play grounds, a future par 3 - 9 hole golf course, a dog exercise area, basketball and tennis courts, a skate park, picnic areas, trails, and other future City projects.

Mayor Jim Hrouda stated that, "A Hickman Parks Foundation 501(c)3 will be formed to help with capital campaign fund raising and marketing the regional complex." The new Hickman Parks Foundation will be in addition to the existing Hickman Area Community Foundation Group. A considerable amount of work still lies ahead for such a community driven complex to become a reality. Additional planning, fund raising, and marketing are all necessary in the years to come to make this a regional event attraction.

Brett Baker, Hickman City Administrator and Economic Development Director, stated "The planning of such a project has been very exciting and time consuming. We feel we have provided for nearly every regional recreational need. The complex design is promoting regional use, shared facilities with the school district, economic development opportunities, efficient operation, and recreational and event venues for area residents."

Community growth, recreational needs, and economic opportunities have driven the development of the master plan and complex concept. According to David Potter of JEO Consulting Group, Inc., "Once developed, the complex will become a recreational and event destination facility with endless possibilities in economic development, recreational options, and community activities."



**Proposed Site Layout Plan**








COMPUTERIZED PLAYGROUND







# Enrollment







Let's get it started!

# Engine Build Competition remains popular attraction

Perhaps it's not the way SCC Automotive Technology instructors intended, but when a student is chosen to participate in the Engine Build Competition, it's a big deal.

From the first event in Sioux City, Iowa, in 2001, Automotive Technology students from the Milford Campus have expended enough energy to run a small power plant, all the while entertaining crowds for the 14 minutes it takes to assemble and start the engine.

"I know we're getting students because of this event," said Jerry Norris, Automotive Technology instructor and one of the first organizers. "We handpick students to be on the teams. I've had many students upset that they weren't selected. They've said to me, 'I came here because I wanted to be on that team.'"

The competition, pitting two teams of two students each, has received local, regional and some national attention. What began as a request for volunteers has become a careful selection process by Norris, Program Chair Rick Morphew and instructors Jerry Kumke and Kevin Uhler.

"We want to make sure we get the right student representing the College well," Morphew said. "Generally, they are third-quarter students, because we want them around the whole summer."

Anywhere from four to six students are invited to "audition" for a spot on a team.

"We bring the students in and practice with them to see how they are as far as coordination and getting the concept and process down for doing this," Morphew said. "Once we see how well they work as a team, we make the selections."

Once chosen, students spend countless hours practicing to have a thorough understanding of the process.

"They need to know which size socket to use and what order the parts need to go on," Morphew said. "We practice almost every day until the end of the spring quarter."

Scheduled competitions vary throughout the year. Students have performed at car shows, race tracks (including I-80 Speedway) and at SCC's All-College Open House. Morphew said the audience that an event attracts often drives the decision of whether to hold the competition.

"The name of the game is to recruit students," he said. "Sometimes a kid doesn't know what he wants to do and sees

this. I know of five students who specifically came here because they saw the competition. Who knows what turns a student on? Maybe this was the thing that tripped their trigger. Maybe this helped them make a final decision."

SCC instructors got the idea for an engine build competition 10 years ago after seeing Marshall Engines of Kearney do it to promote its high-performance engines. Morphew said the Marshall Engines team went all over the nation.

"Jerry Norris and Kevin Uhler thought that was a tremendous idea to promote our program," Morphew said.

Morphew said the competition has received support from local and national companies in the form of parts and gasket sets.

The school record is 13 minutes, 56 seconds set in July 2009 at the Kearney Cruise Night by the team of Josh DeVries of Cortland (Norris High School) and Andrew Kittoe of Hazard (Litchfield High School). The other team competing was Tom Finn of Omaha and Tyson Jochum of Falls City.





# Reinhard shares teaching philosophy

As an instructor, my primary philosophy is always to develop positive relationships with students and foster in them an interest and understanding of our physical world and the scientific principles with which we understand it, so they continue to develop a lifelong love of learning. A part of this approach is to always try and treat students with respect, regardless of the level of success they might be achieving in class. It is always more challenging to keep a positive attitude with students who struggle to gain concepts, versus the students who are more successful. I try to treat them all with the same dignity.

My classroom goal has always been to develop the best possible learning environment with the materials available. Over the years, I have continued to develop a classroom and laboratory setting that is designed to give students an integrated hands-on approach to learning physics and astronomy. My hope is that, in this interactive setting, the student will have the opportunity to gain a better insight of the physical and astronomical concepts they are studying. I've been able to improve the learning environment by attending local and national workshops and participating in technology development groups. I try to stay open to new ideas that might improve the classroom process and give students a better educational experience.

When I reflect on what it means to be a teacher, I think of both responsibility and enjoyment. I believe I have benefitted a great deal from each teacher in my life, all of whom taught me some important aspect of what it means to be a part of our complex and intriguing universe. I feel it is my job to continue this transfer of knowledge and experience to those who come along in succeeding years. It is important to give something back to society in a positive and constructive manner. I also think about the



enjoyment I get when seeing a student as they process through the subject or material and then the "light bulb" comes on. This moment, when they come to an understanding of something new, has pushed them into a broader realm of awareness, and changes how they view the world in some way. When this type of event happens, I'm pleased to have played a small part in the learning process.

Most of my inspiration to be the teacher I am, today probably came from my father, Jerry Reinhard. He influenced me in many ways, but most importantly, he modeled how to treat people and how to be person of honorable character. Another person who was a significant influence was my

high school physics teacher, Jim Ingram. He encouraged me to explore beyond the prescribed basic curriculum, and even allowed me to build a telescope mirror by hand as a semester project. To be able to explore something outside the regular curriculum was a driving factor for me to pursue physics and astronomy. In addition, I'd have to say that some of my professional peers have been important contributors to who I am as an instructor. Dr. Robert Houston at the University of New Hampshire, Lois Mayo at Pius X High School, Dr. Ed Schmidt at the University of Nebraska, and Robert Curtwright at Northeast High School all supported, advised and, in part, taught me to be a science teacher. As I mentioned, I believe I have benefitted, over the years, from many "teachers." Each one of them had something to offer as a role model, and they had a significant impact on who I am and the way I teach and reach my students today.

pursuing a college career to consider SCC. The staff is more than helpful, and the instructors genuinely care about each student's success. I felt as though everyone was family. Thanks to SCC, I had all the foundations I needed to become a success at UNO, where I was able to focus on classes pertaining to my Recreational Therapy major. I became involved in a variety of extracurricular activities, including Adaptive Golf, Adaptive Water Skiing, Adaptive Bowling, and Wheelchair Softball. 
