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Property owners have until June 30, 2015 to file a property valuation protest with the Lancaster County Clerk's Office. Protests may be filed electronically at www.lancaster.ne.gov (keyword: protest), by mail or in person in the County Clerk's Office located at 555 S. 10th Street, Room 108, Lincoln, NE. Forms can be requested by calling the Clerk's Office at 402-441-8724. Office hours are 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday-Friday. Mail must be postmarked no later than June 30th.

Lancaster County Clerk Dan Nolte said a large volume of protests is anticipated this year due to a county-wide revaluation of property. He encourages property owners to file their protests as early in June as possible.

"Persons filing a valuation protest early in the month will have more days available from which to schedule a hearing with an independent referee. As more filings occur later in the month, hearing dates will begin to fill up. The sooner a property owner files a protest, the more convenient hearing times they will find available," he said.

As in other years, property valuation protest hearings will be held from mid-June to mid-July at the Lancaster Event Center located at 4100 N. 84th Street (84th & Havelock) in Pavilion 3.
