## **Election Commissioner Announces Voter Registration Sites for March 22<sup>nd</sup> and March 24<sup>th</sup>**

LINCOLN -- The Lancaster County Election Commissioner will conduct voter registration at two sites on Tuesday, March 22<sup>nd</sup> and Thursday, March 24<sup>th</sup>. Any Nebraska resident who will be 18 on or before November 8, 2016, has moved, changed his or her name, or would like to change their political party affiliation, may register to vote at the following times and locations:

Thursday, March 24<sup>th</sup>  
Russ's Market

4:30 p.m. – 6:00 p.m.

In addition, voter registration is available online if a voter has a Nebraska Driver's License or State Identification card. Online voter registration must be completed no later than Friday, April 22, 2016 in order to be effective for the May 10<sup>th</sup> Primary election. Individuals may also register to vote through the mail. Mail-in registration forms are available at most post offices, banks, and libraries. A voter registration form is also available on the Election Commissioner's web site which may be downloaded, printed and mailed to the Election Commissioner's office. Mail-in voter registration applications must be post marked no later than Friday, April 22, 2016, in order to be effective for the May 10<sup>th</sup> Primary Election.

Citizens may also register to vote at the Election Commissioner's Office, 601 North 46<sup>th</sup> Street, through Monday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>. The office is open weekdays from 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. through Friday, April 29<sup>th</sup> and will be open from 8:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. on Monday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>.
