Individuals may also register to vote through the mail. Mail-in registration forms are available at most post offices, banks, libraries and on page 80 of the blue pages in the Windstream telephone book. A voter registration form is also available on the Election Commissioner's web site which may be downloaded, printed and mailed to the Election Commissioner's office. The web site address is: www.lancaster.ne.gov/election. Mail-in voter registration applications must be post marked no later than Friday, October 15th in order to be effective for the November 2nd General Election.
