



72-HOUR KIT FOR YOUR HOME

It's never too early to prepare!
Disasters seldom give warning and are often
devastating to their victims.

Prepare yourself for a minimum of 3 days.
Due to overwhelming need or no road access, emergency services may
not be available for up to 72 hours after a major disaster.



Storing Emergency Supplies

- ! **Choose a location** such as a closet or “safety corner” in the garage, where it is cool and dark. If you live in an apartment or have limited space, be innovative. Other possible storage locations include under the bed, under stairways, or even in a large box or plastic tub that can be covered with a tablecloth and used as an end table.
- ! **Layer supplies as shown** and keep them together in a container such as a plastic garbage can or clothes hamper with wheels. Check every 6 months for food expiration dates, children’s clothing sizes, etc.
- ! **Start with what you already have.** If you are a camper or backpacker, you’ve got a head start. Your tent, cook stove, and other gear can double as emergency supplies.
