County Treasurer will no longer automatically mail out property tax receipts

County Treasurer Andy Stebbing, announced today that he intends to save approximately \$50,000 annually by mailing tax payment receipts only upon request.

“Under a new statute passed by the State Legislature, property tax receipts will be sent only to those citizens contacting our office and requesting one”, said County Treasurer Andy Stebbing.

“We intend to take advantage of this new statute and believe a savings of \$50,000 per year could be experienced by the tax payer with the reduction in labor, supplies, printing and postage costs.”

Property tax receipts are sent by mail twice a year to approximately 60,000 people. The remaining property owners use some type of escrow service and receive their receipt through their loan holder.

Stebbing said that his office has added an easy online tax receipt printing page on the County Treasurer website and will be adding a phone voice prompt.

Tax receipts will still be available at no cost for those who request one by contacting the County Treasurers office.
