Lancaster County Second Half Real Estate and Personal Property Tax Due by August 1

Lincoln, NE – July 10, 2017 – The second half of the Lancaster County real estate and personal property taxes are delinquent on August 1, 2017.

Parcel owners can make their payments online at Lancaster.ne.gov/Treasurer. There is a convenience fee for online payments. Citizens can also make payments in person at the Treasurer's office located at 555 S. 10th Street, or drop off payments at either satellite location, at 625 N. 46th Street or 500 W. "O" Street, in Lincoln. Additionally, payments can be made using the electronic home bill pay, electronically through your bank or a bill payment service of your choice. Taxpayers can also mail in payments to the Treasurer's office at: 555 South 10th Street, Suite 102, Lincoln, NE 68508. Lancaster County Treasurer Andy Stebbing noted that, "If payment is mailed, please allow 5-7 business days for processing."
