RE: Annual Report FY 17-18

The Crisis Center received **694** admissions during Fiscal Year 2017-2018, which reflects data from 575 different persons. A total of 3840 patient days were logged during this time period with an average length of stay of **5.52** days.

The percentage, this year, of persons dually diagnosed with substance abuse and mental illness was 49%, those with only a diagnosis of mental illness was 38%, while those with only a substance abuse diagnosis was 13%.

One hundred sixty five individuals (24%) attended a Mental Health Board Hearing. 64 admissions resulted in commitment to an inpatient setting (9%) and stayed at the CC an average of 17 days. Those persons were placed as follows:

Ninety one were placed on an outpatient commitment (13%) and stayed an average of 9.6 days. Seven were placed on a 90 day suspension (1%). Five hundred twenty nine (76%) were released to community services with referral but no hold, and stayed on average 3.4 days. There were three board discharges and two individuals were pending discharge.

The Crisis Center accumulated 714 post commitment bed days this fiscal year.
